



RETRACING THE FOOTSTEPS OF BURNS

A combined event will be held by the Dunedin Burns Club with the Southern Heritage Trust, guests and all those with an interest in our Scottish heritage, at the Gasworks Museum, South Dunedin, at 2 pm on Sunday 16 September. Seán Brosnahan will give a presentation with photographs of his recent Robert Burns Pilgrimage to Scotland in which he retraced the footsteps of Burns. The presentation will start in the Fitting Shop at 2 pm and be followed by afternoon tea with pikelets and a tour of the Gasworks Museum with working steam pumping machinery and boiler. A charge will be made to cover the cost of the afternoon tea and the museum tour. It is not expected to exceed \$10. The Dunedin Gasworks was New Zealand’s first and last gasworks, operating from 1863 until 1987. The museum is located at 20 Braemar Street, South Dunedin (near the South Dunedin Warehouse and Pak'n'Save). www.gasworksmuseum.org.nz
